Donor Care Partner – Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is a Care Partner?

Care Partners help the patient recover after surgery. They support the patient's health and well-being by assisting with medications, transportation, and help around the house.

2. What are the responsibilities of a Donor Care Partner?

The Care Partner is responsible for helping the donor with recovery after surgery. This includes:

- A ride home from the hospital.
- Driving them places while they are taking pain medication.
- Help with lifting activities. Donors will not be allowed to lift more than 10 pounds.
- Help around the house and with errands as needed.
- 3. Can the donor and the recipient have the same Care Partner?

No, if the donor is donating directly to the recipient. We understand that there are situations where it would be easiest to have the same Care Partner. However, we have found that having the same Care Partner means one person has less care and attention. For donors considering advanced donation, having the same Care Partner is acceptable.
